

Cost

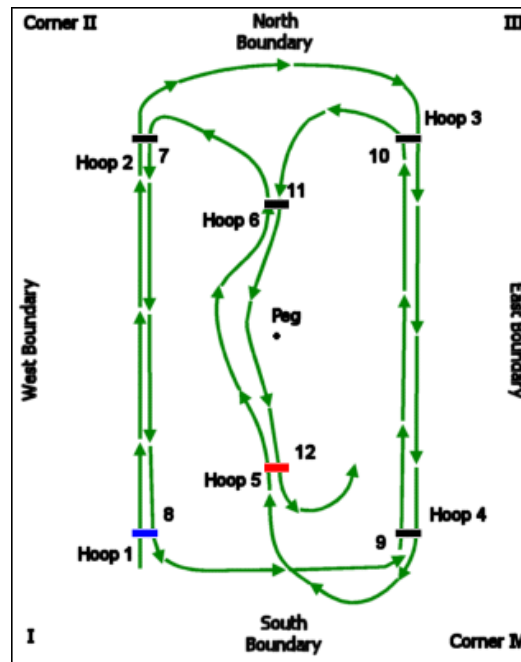

What is Golf Croquet?

Golf croquet is a mallet sport where the players follow a course contesting each hoop in turn. As soon as one hoop is scored all players move on to contest the next.

A simple idea that leads to a variety of options and rich tactical thinking.

Options for schools to Participate

- * Students from years 7 – 12 to learn Golf Croquet at local clubs in terms 1 and 4,
- * Students attend a club one afternoon a week after school,
- * Scheduled P.E. lessons at a club,
- * Play at a club during term four Activities Week,
- * Pop-Up croquet where clubs go to schools with equipment. Several sessions could be conducted throughout the day,
- * Throughout the year there will be opportunities for competitions on Friday afternoons at our state headquarters on Hutt Road.



Pathways

Throughout the year there will be opportunities for students to compete at Croquet SA Headquarters at Hutt Road on Friday afternoons.

There are also opportunities for students to develop their skills and participate at Club, State, National and International level. In November the 2015 National School Students competition will be held in N.S.W and the under 21 World Championship is held regularly. In 2015 it was held in New Zealand and will be in Melbourne in 2017.
